



Upgrading the Pacific Highway

Bonville upgrade

This project is jointly funded by the Australian and New South Wales governments

The NSW Roads and Traffic Authority has engaged Abigroup Contractors Pty Ltd to undertake the design, construction and 10-year maintenance of the 9.6km Pacific Highway upgrade at Bonville.

Construction activities – July to September 2008

Works are now being finalised along the entire length of the Bonville upgrade, including all local roads. Works during the next three months will include:

- Completion of all structures along the Bonville upgrade including the fauna overpass and the Reedys Creek twin bridges.
- Completion of the main alignment, traffic is expected to be switched from the existing Pacific Highway to the new Bonville upgrade in August 2008 weather permitting.
- Continuing work to local roads after the opening of the main alignment to highway traffic, this includes the construction of roundabouts at Mailmans Track and the intersection of Archville Station Road and the existing Pacific Highway.
- Continuing work at the northern end of the project at Lyons Road, once Pacific Highway traffic has been switched to the new Bonville upgrade.
- Continuing general finishing works (including landscaping etc) are expected to be ongoing through to late 2008.

Changes to traffic conditions

East Bonville Road Bridge is scheduled for opening to local traffic in July 2008.

The upgrade is scheduled to be opened to Pacific Highway traffic in August 2008 weather permitting.

Mailmans Track interchange is scheduled to be opened to traffic in late 2008.

Safety

Please observe all project signage and traffic control directions during construction.

Construction hours

Monday to Friday 7am to 6pm and Saturday 8am to 1pm. Nearby residents will be advised of any construction works occurring outside normal working hours.
